Patrick Lambe is a world-renowned knowledge organization and taxonomy expert with a specialization in knowledge organization systems to enable the conduct of science. He is a consultant, writer and researcher, based in Singapore, and with projects in the USA, Europe, Middle East, Asia and Australia.

In the field of taxonomies for R&D he has worked since 2009 with the National Science Foundation (Division of Science Resource Statistics and NCSSES) to help them develop a framework, strategy and implementation framework for science classifications and taxonomy management, and with Unilever Research helping them to develop a taxonomy strategy and framework.

He is the author of *Organising Knowledge: Taxonomies, Knowledge and Organisation Effectiveness* (Oxford, 2007), an Adjunct Professor in knowledge management at the Hong Kong Polytechnic University, Visiting Professor in the Knowledge and Innovation Management PhD programme at Bangkok University, 2-term past President of the Information and Knowledge Management Society and a member of the editorial advisory boards of the top-ranked *Journal of Knowledge Management*, and of *Knowledge Management For Development Journal*, and *Journal of Entrepreneurship, Management and Innovation*. His 2011 paper on “The Unacknowledged Parentage of Knowledge Management” won a Highly Commended Award in the Emerald Literati Network Awards for Excellence 2012. Patrick is also a member of the AIIM KM Standards Committee (KM for Organizations). He is currently working on a book on *Knowledge Auditing and Knowledge Mapping*.
